Flintlock lock with a heart-shaped hammer and straight crest, signed 'Manuf Imp de St Etienne', with a hallmark depicting a 'S' within a diamond for Stelen. Brass lock plate and trigger guard. Wooden stock. Steel ramrod with a 'nail head' tip. Hallmarks depicting a crowned 'G' for Guichard, the fittings inspector.
