It is topped with a solid forged steel tip, characteristic of self-defense canes designed to provide greater stability as well as a deterrent effect. The handle features a beautiful patina from use as well as an old crack from shrinkage--a common feature on antique horn pieces--which does not compromise the overall strength of the cane.
