The interior, painted light gray, includes two spacious compartments and two central doors flanked by six dovetail drawers, each fitted with brass handles. The doors open on brass hinges; the left door is secured by a hook at the top, while the right door is adorned with a brass lock and has a functional lock. The entire piece boasts a beautiful warm hue and a silky sheen, thanks to its original wax finish. The light
