An elegant Louis XV-style ladies' writing desk with a drop-down lid serving as a weekly planner, crafted in the late 19th century. It is veneered in curly rosewood and topped with a white marble slab. This piece stands out for its lavish trim of chiseled and gilded bronze, which adorns the entire front: pull handles, lock plates, corner finials, feet, ingot holders, clasps, moldings, and beltwork ornamentation, all of which lend the piece a particularly refined character. The flap, trimmed with red leather accented with gold and small metal studs, reveals a functional interior consisting of two small drawers and storage compartments. The lower section consists of six curved drawers offering ample storage.
