Consolle in carved and gilded wood with marble top. Florentine carver after a design by Giovanni Battista Foggini (Florence 1655 - 1725).

cm. Wall console entirely carved in gilded wood,

with a period polychrome marble top,

contemporary with the base, featuring an

ochre-yellow ground with black and grey veining.

The structure rests on a single central support in

the form of a winged herm, its arms outstretched

to carry the broad lower rail. The figurative motif,

traceable to the designs of Giovanni Battista

Foggini, court sculptor and architect to the

Medici, unfolds in scrollwork and foliage in a

fully Baroque idiom. The apron features arched

openings on both sides. The base has a shaped,

multi-lobed plan. The marble top, of demilune

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profile with moulded edges, displays particularly fine radial veining. Good overall condition. Gilding wear consistent with age and use.
