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JCM graduated from the École Supérieure des Arts Appliqués in Paris in 1966. Ten years later, he founded his own contemporary furniture design company. Working closely with his wife, Betty Mahey, they presented numerous designs that were distributed in France and around the world. Using elegant materials such as lacquer, precious metals, rich woods, and marble, Mahey's creations are crafted in their own workshop. In 1992, they opened their showroom in central Paris and gradually brought their children, Cecilia and Maxence, into the business. His work is often compared to or attributed to Willy Rizzo (Mario Sabot edition) or Romeo Rega.
