Description

A vibrant and poetic watercolor titled *La Place des Vosges*, created by the artist Thérèse Hummel (1896-1967). In this balanced composition, the artist captures the joyful atmosphere of the famous Parisian square. It features the iconic 17th-century architecture with pink bricks and greenish slate roofs, bordering the central garden structured around its monumental fountain and avenues of linden trees. In the foreground, children play with a ball, stroll, and have fun near the pond, watched over by elegant figures seated on the park's benches. Thérèse Hummel uses a fresh, rhythmic palette, dominated by the deep green of the vegetation and the ochre-pink of the facades and paths, accented by small white dots representing gravel or light. The spontaneity of the ink lines blends

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perfectly with the delicacy of the watercolor washes. A prominent figure in Parisian artistic circles during the first half of the 20th century, Thérèse Hummel belongs to that generation of independent female artists who flourished at the heart of modernity. Biography / About the Artist Thérèse HUMMEL (1896-1967) Close to the leading figures of the Montparnasse and Montmartre avant-garde, she shared special friendships with Jeanne Hébuterne, Amedeo Modigliani, and Pablo Picasso. Immersed in this exceptional creative effervescence, her work is characterized by remarkable artistic freedom, combining the poetry of everyday life, the simplification of forms, and the expressiveness of color. Her works, highly sought-after and rare on the market, offer a precious testament to the creative spirit of the School of Paris.
