Description

An eighteenth-century Sèvres porcelain dish, date code for 1767, with bleu-lapis ground and 6-lobed rim, decorated with vermiculé gilding and three pentafoil reserves, painted with children in landscape settings: a boy harvesting grapes, a boy fishing, and a girl with a sheaf of wheat, the centre with gilt trellis ornament and three oak leaf garlands. Measurements: Diameter: 21.6 cm (8.5 in) Height: 4 cm (1.6 in) Maker's marks: Interlaced LL monogram enclosing "O" date letter.

Decorator's mark "R". Condition: In very good, original condition, with no cracks or chips. There are two small indentations under the gilding of the central section and a small recess in the outer edge of the base rim, underneath the gilded band. Both are original to the manufacture. No restoration was found under examination with

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ultraviolet light, and the dish rings clearly when tapped with a knuckle. Shipping: Free to UK, EU, Canada, Australia, Asia, USA, and most other destinations. Please note that any import charges/sales taxes are the buyer's responsibility.
