



Jorrez: Rare 18th-century Solid Silver Dish With The Saint Malo Coat Of Arms, 1769-72

Description

SAINT-MALO 1769-72Extremely rare, heavy, round Saint-Malo dish in solid 18th-century silver, featuring a filleted border design. The rim is engraved with the coat of arms of the alliance, surmounted by a Marquis's crown and bearing the motto "INNOCENTIBUS NON NOCENT."

Hallmarks for the maker's mark (a crowned "M") and the assayer's mark (a tower), Common City Hall hallmark for SAINT MALO 1769-72 (letter "I" surmounted by a three-masted ship) and the hallmark of Master Goldsmith Pierre-Louis JORREZ (Hallmark featuring the initials "PL" divided by an ermine, a "J" below, and the two grains of remedy, all crowned) received in 1741 to practice in Port Louis; he later moved his business to Saint-Malo. Extremely rare, heavy, heraldic dish from Saint-Malo in very good
