Description

Tülü are iconic pieces in many respects. They belong to the broad family of everyday objects crafted by the nomadic peoples of Anatolia. Before addressing the technical aspects of their production and the various uses of such pieces, I would like to focus on their purely artistic dimension. The format, the burst of colors, and the composition inevitably remind me of a work of contemporary art, somewhere between painting and sculpture. The material--the fibers--are made of Angora goat wool known as mohair, renowned for its thermal insulation properties as well as its lustrous sheen, comparable to silk. It's impossible to resist touching it or even playing with its contours with your hand. The vibrant energy of this piece draws us in body and soul; it captivates the gaze with its

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circular patterns. It's a true emotional spectacle...Rest assured, you're not reading AI-generated text--that's not our style! Now, back to the matter at hand: the piece is woven wool-on-wool, and its technical distinction lies in the long strands of wool inserted into the weft in successive rows. The piece features two distinct sides--brace yourselves--one for summer, the other for winter. Tülüs are the ancestors of our mattresses; they were also used as blankets. It's even said that some were placed at the entrance to tents to block scorpions, which struggled to move across the uneven surface created by the long strands of wool.
