Description

Three antique Chinese pottery jars with sancai glaze. Authentic, hand-thrown jars with individually crafted lids. Although the distinctive sancai ("three colors") style reached its peak during the Tang Dynasty (618-907), this technique was revived in later periods. The more massive forms, the stylized incised patterns around the shoulder, and the characteristic fading of the green glaze are typical of utilitarian and funerary pottery produced during the Liao, Song, or Ming dynasties. The surface shows significant signs of weathering due to burial and glaze deterioration, including iridescent mineralization and flaking in places. Two jars with lids and one jar without a lid. Left jar: 19 cm wide, 18.5 cm tall (without lid), base diameter 10 cm, and neck diameter 11 cm. The lid measures 13 cm wide.
