Description

Polychrome Straw-Inlaid Sewing Box, 19th Century
An exquisite French sewing box from the second half of the 19th century, a fine example of the art of straw inlay, a decorative technique that requires extraordinary precision and masterful craftsmanship. The surface of the lid is embellished with a delicate floral composition featuring a central vase, created using extremely thin strips of natural and dyed straw, skillfully arranged to produce an elegant, luminous polychrome effect. The rectangular box conceals a practical pull-out drawer, lined internally with decorative multicolored striped paper, originally intended to hold sewing accessories. The sides feature a refined geometric inlay pattern that harmoniously completes the ensemble. An object of great charm and rare sophistication, it
