A small barrel or name-marked flask made of Nevers earthenware dating from the late 18th century. It features a revolutionary polychrome decoration depicting a cannon surmounted by a rooster, a symbol of vigilance over the Nation. The piece bears a personalized inscription indicating the owner's name, "Jean Durand," and the date "1793." Its barrel-shaped form ("tonnelet") with handles is characteristic of pilgrim gourds produced in this region. The hand-painted "N" mark is characteristic of products from the Nevers earthenware factory. Piece dated 1793 featuring a rooster on the body. The inscription "Jean Durand, owner" adds historical value and a unique touch of folk art. Good overall condition. Please note: there is chipped enamel, a small chip on the neck, and a
