Description

Marny was born in Paris; his real name may have been Paul François or Charles Paul Goddard. He worked in theater and as a porcelain decorator for the Sèvres porcelain factory before moving to Belfast to work for a French architect. In 1860, he moved to Scarborough at the suggestion of Oliver Sarony, a pioneer of photography and brother of Napoléon Sarony.[1][2] There, he taught Albert Strange and other artists in Scarborough. William Tindall was his brother-in-law. Marny exhibited at the Royal Academy. In 1874, the British Journal of Photography reported: "A Frenchman, Mr. Paul Marny Goddard, of Paris, has obtained a patent for the application of carbon printing to porcelain or other similar materials, which, after the image is developed, receive a layer of transparent glaze..." He died in Scarborough, North
