Silkscreen print "Tridim-Kek" by Victor Vasalery
The work "Tridim-Kek" is a magnificent example of his iconic Op Art style, in which he uses axonometric perspectives and a meticulously crafted gradient of blue to create a powerful three-dimensional illusion of floating cubes interlocked with one another. The term "Tridim" refers to three-dimensionality, and "Kék" simply means "blue" in Hungarian. Victor Vasalery (1906-1997) was a Franco-Hungarian artist recognized worldwide as the founder and "father" of Op Art (optical art). The softly colored mat creates a soothing "breathing space" between the densely detailed blue artwork and the aluminum frame. The optical illusion and the deep blue colors thus stand out even more vividly. At the bottom center is a sleek gray
