This high-quality piece stands out for its architecturally designed front featuring three doors. The minimalist design is accentuated by the sculpted geometry of the door panels and by superb organic handles carved directly into the solid wood. The visible, meticulous joints underscore the high-end craftsmanship characteristic of Regain's productions.
