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Casa de Velázquez in Madrid (1929) Knight of the Legion of Honor Biographical Notes & Style Artistic Lineage: The son of the famous Metz-based sculptor Emmanuel Hannaux, he maintained strong ties to Lorraine and Metz even while living in Paris. Style & Influences: A blend of classical rigor and modernist/expressionist sensibility (notably inspired by Oskar Kokoschka). His palette evolved from muted, earthy tones during his stay in Spain to vivid, colorful light under the influence of Delacroix. Favorite Themes: Orientalist scenes, travel landscapes (Spain, Morocco, Sub-Saharan Africa, Italy/Venice, Yugoslavia), floral still lifes, and genre scenes (carnivals, the circus, musicians). In collections: His works are held at the National Center for the Visual Arts (CNAP), the Metz Museum, and in Bayonne, Madrid, Salzburg, and Rio de Janeiro. A superb work by Paul Hannaux, winner of the Prix de Rome in 1924 and a fellow of the Casa de Velázquez. This landscape attests to the artist's technical mastery and spontaneous brushwork. It showcases his characteristic treatment of texture and his sensitivity to light. Period: Art Deco (circa 1920-1930).
