Description

A finely chiseled and gilded bronze wall sconce known as the "ribbon" style. The antique-style fire bowl is adorned with fluting and rosettes. The handles support a wide draped ribbon framing a female mask. Sides decorated with palm leaves, grooves, and side vents adorned with openwork grilles featuring small flowers on a green silk background. Large enameled dial with Roman numerals for the hours and Arabic numerals for the minutes, signed "Warin à Paris." Original openwork hands, bezel with domed glass. Lower section adorned with a garland of laurel leaves. Pomegranate-shaped base, surmounted by a frieze of fleurons. Serviced movement, signed Warin in Paris. Sold with its instruction manual.
