A set of four chairs lacquered in gray with gold accents, resting on four curved legs. The cabriolet-style backrest is fluted, carved with acanthus leaves at the shoulders and featuring a floral composition in the center. The ornate seat band features a central carving that echoes the design on the backrest. The upper portions of the legs are also carved with floral motifs. The entire seat is molded. Stamped "Burgat" Louis XV period. Normal wear and tear; modern upholstery. H. 85 x W. 54 x D. 46 cm. Claude Louis Burgat was a French cabinetmaker who became a master craftsman in 1744. He produced Louis XV-style chairs of exceptional quality, as evidenced by Pierre Kjellberg's commentary in his book **Le mobilier français du XVII**.
