A large, lidded cylindrical goblet known as an "officer's goblet," made of solid silver by the silversmith Berudin. The body and lid are plain. The handle is neoclassical in style; the lid knob is made of turned ebony (with a slight play). Each part is hallmarked. Hallmarks: o 1st rooster, 1st title (hallmark for 950/1000 solid silver in Paris between 1798 and 1809).o Paris guarantee.o Goldsmiths' Guild: head of a Greek woman with the number 1.o Master silversmith: J F on a slate (unidentified) Height: 12 cm / handle length: 11.5 cmdiameter at the rim: 8.5 cm / base 7.5 cmWeight: 246.83 grams.Good overall condition; minor wear and tear from useThese silver goblets with handles were used by officers during military campaigns.
