Description

Original drawing. Pen, graphite, and watercolor. 46 x 33.5 cm (image size), in a frame measuring 62.5 x 50 cm. A few slight scratches on the drawing. Title at the bottom of the drawing: "Commune of Périers - Town Hall Project - Perspective View." Signed lower right, above the title: "P. Paisan-Duclos." The town of Périers is located in the Manche department, north of Coutances and northwest of Saint-Lô. Its town hall was built between 1872 and 1875, following a competition launched in 1868 and won by the Parisian architect Frédéric Léon Fleury (1844-1931). Gustave Raulin received second prize. The construction project was supervised on site by the architect for the Coutances district, Pierre Desheulles. Paul Paisant-Duclos (1843-1909), a native of Lisieux (Calvados) and

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the son of an architect (his father, Richard Gabriel Paisant, was an architect and public works engineer for the Lisieux district), was a student of Simon Constant-Dufeux and Émile Vaudremer at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris. He worked primarily in Caen and Paris (private residences). He exhibited at the Salon des Artistes Français beginning in 1870 and, that year, submitted a set of seven drawings for the Périers City Hall, which were likely those he entered in the competition.
