A beautiful, large Directoire-style dining table dating from the late 18th century, crafted from mahogany. When closed, this table features an elegant round top measuring 113.5 cm in diameter, composed of several folding panels. It rests on six turned baluster legs, typical of this period, which lend it great elegance while ensuring good stability when extended. Its ingenious design allows the table to be extended considerably. When fully extended with its extensions, it reaches a length of 2.60 meters, comfortably seating a large group of guests. The photographs clearly show the extension mechanism and the unfolding of the central structure. The original mahogany sections feature a beautiful, deep, warm hue, with
