



18th-century Wall-mounted Shelf



Description

Wall-mounted shelf made of cherry wood with amaranth inlay. The lower section opens with two doors inlaid with Maltese crosses and lozenges; the period wrought-iron lock plates echo this motif. The sides of the upper shelves are openwork with multilobed motifs and hearts. This shelf rests on a scalloped side base. The original antique hardware has been preserved: keyholes, latches, lock, and mounting brackets. A piece from the Louis XV period. A shelf for sale at the Dantan Gallery and stamped by Jean-François Coulon, who was admitted as a master on January 10, 1732, in Paris and resided on Rue du Vieux-Colombier, suggests that this piece was likely produced in Paris. Condition: two missing sections of the molding, a localized crack on one side that does not affect structural integrity,
