Large Chinese "Cizhou" jar made of glazed stoneware. Stoneware with a cream-colored base, decorated with stylized flowers, friezes, and bands. China, Yuan Dynasty (1271-1368) or Ming Dynasty (1368-1644). Can be converted into a lamp using the included mounting system and lampshade. It was originally used to store rice wine and other traditional grain-based spirits. Cizhou ceramics first appeared during the Song Dynasty (960-1279) in what are now Hebei and Henan provinces and continued until the end of the Ming Dynasty. Dimensions: H 55, Diameter 33 cm, Neck diameter 15 cm.
