Pair of Napoleon III-era crapaud armchairs, dating from the late 19th century. These Second Empire-era chairs are immediately recognizable by their stocky silhouette, fully upholstered in fabric for maximum comfort and featuring tufting--a staple of 19th-century bourgeois living rooms. Furniture Details Frame & Legs: The armchairs rest at the front on two blackened (or stained) wooden legs, finely turned into baluster shapes with casters, while the rear legs feature the discreet "saber" shape. Upholstery: The backrests are slightly sloped and enveloping, with so-called "suspended" or integrated armrests. Fabric: They have been reupholstered with a thick tapestry or jacquard fabric on a black background, adorned with an exuberant floral pattern in shades of orange, rust, and yellow. 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modernizes their historic look while respecting the opulent spirit of the original era. Condition: The seat is firm, and the fabric is in excellent visible condition, with no significant wear or discoloration--a valuable asset, as the cost of professional reupholstering often exceeds the intrinsic value of the furniture.
