Description

The 19th-century fascination with historical artifacts, fueled by nostalgia for the Ancien Régime, inspired many artisans to imitate these long-lost objects. In 1845, Edme Samson founded his porcelain and earthenware factory in Paris, where the bulk of the work involved reproducing pieces from the 18th century. He participated in major industrial exhibitions and enjoyed immense success. He interpreted--sometimes freely--the styles of the great manufacturers, both Asian and European. Here, he reworks a well-known mythological decorative motif from Moustiers dating to the 18th century, adding colors that are not quite consistent with the original pieces (that bright blue along the border). On the underside is a forged Olerys signature, and--a nice touch--an old 19th-century store label. The piece is in
