Description

Stunning military hussar figurine by Bisson, made of biscuit porcelain. Probably from the early 19th century. A hussar in the Revolutionary Army, Bisson is said to have distinguished himself during the Battle of Fleurus in 1794; the statuette is inscribed on the base "Fleurus 1794," and his name appears on the back: "Bisson Hussar". It is very finely crafted; the facial expression is superbly rendered, as are the details of the uniform--which are rarely so finely detailed. There are two minor imperfections (a very small chip at the end of a braid and the plume is missing from the shako). Height: 29.5 cm. No visible manufacturer's mark; possibly a biscuit porcelain piece from Sèvres. A similar statuette made of Sèvres terracotta is known to exist, but this particular biscuit porcelain model
