Pair of lively stable scenes 19th-century European school In the style of 17th-century Dutch art d'oils on wooden panels 17 x 22 cm Presented in 20th-century handcrafted frames measuring 32 x 37 cm, featuring an inverted profile with burl veneer and blackened moldings, characteristic of antique mountings. This pair of oil paintings on panels illustrates the rediscovery and enduring influence of the masters of the Dutch Golden Age school throughout the nineteenth century. The subject matter, centered on stable life, riders, white-coated horses, and genre scenes in rustic interiors, draws direct inspiration from the works of Philips Wouwerman (1619-1668) and the painters of the Haarlem School. The wooden panels are sound and unvarnished.
