He painted this "Temptation" in his youth, in 1656, while living in The Hague. In 1662, he settled in Leeuwarden, the capital of Friesland, as a court painter, first for Stadtholder Willem Frederik van Nassau-Dietz, and then, after the latter's sudden death in 1664, for his
