A discreet artist with a style all her own, Irena Jaworska stands out for her desire to create objects that blend modernism and brutalism using innovative techniques. This mirror is typical of her work from the 1960s. This mirror combines several natural materials--such as wood for the frame and glass for the mirror--with "artificially" new materials like Talosel, repoussé metal, and lead-mesh soldering, resulting in this extraordinary piece. The only thing missing is a hanging hook on the back, but this can easily be added. Rare, the objects produced by Irena Jaworska are unusual and sought after by
