PAIR of STIRRUPS known as Abumi JapanEdo Period (1603-1868)Wood and lacquer H.: 26; L.: 26; W.: 13 cm (minor chips and imperfections)Pair of lacquered wooden stirrups with side arms (naga-i) openworked with a fruit motif and a wheat ear, respectively. The front panel (hato) is decorated with maki-e lacquer depicting a churning sea. Wide bases (shita) lacquered red.The distinctive "slipper" or "crescent" shape of these stirrups reflects their practical purpose: they protected the foot from injury and allowed archers (in the Yabusame tradition) to stand firmly and steadily.Ref. 7361Text and photos © FCP CORIDON
