SADDLE called Kura Japan Edo period (1603-1868) Wood and lacquer H.: 27.5; L.: 36.5; W.: 40 cm (minor chips and damage) The pommel (maewa) --a flat piece shaped like an inverted U with a shallow double notch on each side, providing the rider with a grip to mount the horse--is made of black-lacquered wood decorated with maki-e designs featuring kimonos with leaf and geometric motifs. At the rear, the pommel (shizuwa) is made of nashiji lacquer--it has a shape similar to that of the pommel, except that its extensions, beneath the rider's thighs, are curved forward. The two longitudinal pieces (igi) are protruding (igisaki) and feature slots for the stirrup leathers, connecting the pommel to the shizuwa. Signed on the underside. Ref. 7364 Text
