KIMONO HANGER known as Kimonokake
Japan Wood, lacquer, and gilded metal H.: 180 cm
(approx.)(chips and minor imperfections) Kimono
rack (iko or kimonokake) made of lacquered
wood, consisting of two upright posts connected
by three crossbars--the top crossbar has slightly
curved ends. It is fitted with gilded metal
hardware, cut and engraved with scrollwork. The
maki-e lacquer decoration, on a black
background, depicts a large number of family
crests (mon) featuring the triple leaf of the
hollyhock (aoi) within a circle (maruni
mitsubaaoi mon): the symbol of the Owari branch
