A very beautiful portrait of a young woman with a hairstyle and attire characteristic of the Consulate and First Empire periods. It is an anonymous 19th-century work from the French School, executed in charcoal... A very harmonious portrait of this young woman, whose beauty and gentleness are evident. The originality of this drawing lies in the fact that it was cut out and pasted onto binding paper. This gives it a certain relief and lends the drawing an air of mystery and depth. We know the identity of this young woman: F(rançoise?) Duval, wife of Zuméro. The drawing is in good condition and set in a beautiful 19th-century gilded frame, measuring 28 x 22 cm. The entire piece has a lot of charm!
