Description

A small oil painting on panel depicting two figures accompanied by a dog in a dark landscape. One of the figures appears to be playing a stringed instrument. The scene, intimate and folksy, is rendered in a muted color palette enhanced by the figures' clothing. Théodore Lévigne, born in Noirétable in 1848 and died in Lyon in 1912, was a painter representative of the Lyon School. A student at the École des Beaux-Arts in Lyon, and later of Jean-Léon Gérôme and Alexandre Cabanel in Paris, he developed a body of work devoted primarily to landscapes, portraits, and genre scenes.
