WAR HELMET known as KABUTO, za-boshi type Japan Meiji Period (1868-1910) Iron, lacquer, silk, wood Za-boshi-style kabuto; iron hachi with sixteen lamellae and eighty-six protruding rivets; gilded brass fittings. Tehen made of brass, engraved with a stylized chrysanthemum and foliage motifs. Agemaki made of orange silk. Shikoro consisting of two gold-lacquered wooden lamellae, braided with orange silk. Fukigaeshi made of gold-lacquered wood and brass chiseled with floral motifs, the entire piece covered with felt featuring floral and geometric patterns; clan crest appearing on each side. Mabizashi / maebashi decorated in a matching style. Polychrome wooden maedate depicting the dragon Ryu. The kabuto is an object steeped in tradition within Japanese culture. An
