Description

A beautiful 19th-century silverware set, consisting of 12 place settings and a solid silver ladle bearing the Minerva hallmark of the first standard (950/000) from the Napoleon III era, Second Empire. These pieces are "uniplat" cutlery. A timeless design, characterized by great simplicity. This set was produced by the Pierre Queille silversmith's workshop, based in Paris. Pierre Queille's active years: 1847-1880. The Queilles were a prominent family of silversmiths who produced silverware in Paris for nearly a century. Only two spoons, one fork, and the ladle are not by the same silversmith. The set is in good condition. Some signs of age on certain pieces do not affect their use in any way. A storage box for the cutlery will be included, but it does not quite match the cutlery. Dimensions: Length of a fork: 21
