Their enveloping backrests, arranged at right angles, extend naturally to form the armrests. The remarkable turned woodwork is evident on the uprights, crossbars, and legs, giving the piece a particularly decorative silhouette. The traditional construction features mortise-and-tenon joints, dowels, and wooden pegs. The seats have retained their original straw-woven upholstery with geometric patterns, accented with colored strands. The two removable cushions with floral designs, visible in the photographs, will be included with the armchairs. They remain in good overall condition, despite the natural aging of the fabric.
