Description

A fine pair of large Japanese patinated bronze vases, dating from the Meiji period (1868-1912).

Each vase has a globular body rising into a remarkably long cylindrical neck, slightly flared at the rim, giving the pair an elegant and particularly slender silhouette.

The richly detailed decoration extends over the entire height of the vases. Birds, flowering branches and foliage are rendered in relief against a bronze ground with a deep reddish-brown patina. The modelling and variations in surface treatment give depth and presence to the decoration, emphasizing its naturalistic character. The composition continues elegantly along the long neck, further accentuating the verticality and graceful proportions of the pair.

craftsmanship of Japanese metalworkers during the Meiji period, an era in which Japanese metalwork reached an exceptional level of technical refinement, particularly in works created for the Western market.

Both vases bear the Japanese mark "Yoshida-zo" (???), on their bases, literally meaning "made by Yoshida."

A fine pair of late 19th-century Japanese bronzes, notable for their elegant proportions, deep patina and finely executed relief decoration.
