This Turkana bowl, called an atubwa, is carved from wood and is distinguished by its rounded bottom and engraved circular patterns. Intended for food service, it could also serve a ceremonial purpose, particularly during the Asapan, when it was used to hold a mixture of blood and milk intended for the elders. It could also be given as a gift, thereby helping to create and strengthen social bonds between families. Mint condition. Kenya, 20th century.
