Description

950 sterling silver oil cruet set - Paris, 1819-1838. Elegant solid silver table oil cruet, accompanied by two blown-glass cruets with attached handles. Description: The stand rests on a rectangular tray with a molded rim supported by four ball-shaped feet. The two cylindrical compartments are richly decorated with applied palmettes, framed by twisted motifs. In the center, a ring handle allows the set to be carried; it surmounts a symmetrical design of volutes, rosettes, and palmettes, as well as a small central receptacle. A fine example of French silverwork from the Restoration period, still strongly influenced by Empire and Neoclassical decorative styles. The silver bears, notably, the Vieillard (Michel-Ange) hallmark, the 1st Paris fineness mark, as well as the large guarantee hallmark.
