Description

It bears the coat of arms of the town of Marchena (Seville). This crozier was intended for the abbot of a religious community in that same town. It rests on a wooden base that has been attached separately. Most likely made of silver-plated metal (or silver but without a hallmark), this particularly elegant volute-style crozier is adorned with an elaborate openwork design of scrollwork and spirals, surmounted by a fleur-de-lis-shaped finial. In the center of the volute is a large heraldic medallion bearing the coat of arms of Marchena, with the motto COLONIA MARTIA ROMANORUM. The coat of arms features the three arrows associated with Saint Sebastian, patron saint of the city, as well as the heraldic elements linked to the Ponce de León family. 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architectural decoration, composed of niches, pediments, volutes, and plant motifs, attesting to particularly meticulous craftsmanship. The ensemble is rendered in the Spanish rocaille style, with gilding that is still largely preserved. The knot is embellished with semiprecious stones, and the coat of arms surmounts a black stone, likely onyx, as it symbolizes moral strength, steadfastness in faith, and the pastor's perseverance in the face of the trials of his office.
