Description

Oval, lobed sugar bowl with lid, made of fine earthenware, featuring a molded relief decoration of flowering branches and clusters of fruit; the lid is topped with a pear-shaped finial with veined leaves. The rim features a notch for a sprinkling spoon. Lorraine earthenware, possibly attributed to Rambervillers or Moyen, dating from the last third of the 18th century, around 1770-1780. Dimensions: length 13.5 cm - width 9.5 cm - height including the finial 11.5 cm. In very good condition; the enamel has retained its original luster. There are slight, inconspicuous wear marks on the rim. The lid and lid handle are intact.
