Description

Patinated bronze sculpture depicting an Asian woman in a kimono. Signed on the base: P.B. de la Vingtrie Art Nouveau, circa 1890. A magnificent sculpture that has retained a beautiful blue-green patina. A very rare piece! This sculpture was originally mounted as a kerosene lamp and was later converted to electric lighting. Paul Bayard de la Vingtrie made his debut at the 1876 Salon and immediately won a first-class medal for the model of The Snake Charmer (Le Charmeur de serpent), the bronze version of which adorns Parc Monceau in Paris. This same statue earned him a third-class medal at the 1878 Exposition Universelle. He subsequently received several commissions from the State and the City of Paris, including the statue of the painter François Lemoine at the
