Bust of Louise Brongniart, after a model by Jean-Antoine Houdon, in Limoges biscuit porcelain
An elegant depiction of the young woman with a delicate face and her hair styled up, displayed on a blue-glazed porcelain pedestal, accented with gilded trim
Louise Brongniart was the daughter of architect Alexandre-Théodore Brongniart (1739-1813), who designed the Palais Brongniart in Paris, the former headquarters of the Stock Exchange
The original model was created by Houdon in 1777 and remains one of his most remarkable portraits of a child
Marked "Limoges France," with a "L. Duchamp" label beneath the base
