A pair of traditional lotus flower arrangements for Buddhist altars, known as Jyôka, dating approximately from 1900-1920. These permanent floral arrangements were displayed on altars in homes and Buddhist temples as symbolic offerings. The arrangements feature lotus buds, open flowers, and broad leaves arranged on slender metal stems. The floral elements are carved from wood and finished with varnish mixed with gold dust, creating a warm and luminous surface. The flowers are held in black-finished metal vases, with traditional straw bundles inside to secure the stems. The lotus emerges pure and beautiful from muddy water and is one of the most important symbols of Buddhism, representing purity and spiritual awakening. The combination of open flowers,
