Description

Ernest Damé, (1845-1920), Bronze cast with a brown patina. Dated to the late 19th century. Animal sculpture depicting a seated dog, panting, with its tongue hanging out and long, drooping ears, reminiscent of a Saint-Hubert hound (or Bloodhound). Signed on the base, Height 14.5 cm - Width 14 cm - Depth 8.5 cm

Biography Ernest Appolinaire Damé (1845-1920) French sculptor known for his mythological subjects, his allegorical works, and his animal sculptures. A student of Francisque Duret, Eugène-Louis Lequesne, Eugène Guillaume, and Jules Cavelier at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris, Ernest Damé received a second-class medal at the 1875 Salon des Artistes Français, a third-class medal at the 1878 World's Fair, and a bronze medal at the 1900 World's Fair.
