Description

Antique ball bouquet holder from the Palais-Royal. Made of finely crafted mother-of-pearl with a gilded metal setting, circa 1820. The cone-shaped body is formed of wide mother-of-pearl petals with iridescent sheen, arranged like a flower bud and held together at the base by a gilded metal frame adorned with foliage. The long handle, also made of mother-of-pearl, ends in an openwork, sculpted motif in the shape of a plant scroll, characteristic of the refined taste found in the small luxury objects sold in the galleries of the Palais-Royal in Paris. A delicate chain is attached to the bouquet holder and ends in a pin, designed to secure it in place when in use. This type of bouquet holder was used by fashionable women to display and preserve small bouquets of flowers during
