Description

A First Empire-era clock in gilded and chiseled bronze, featuring an allegory of music in the form of a young man in classical attire or a winged genius, surrounded by the lyre--an attribute of Apollo and of music-- a pomegranate, a vase, and an oil lamp--symbols of fertility and abundance. The base features a frieze with putti, plant motifs, vases, and swans facing each other. The dial features recessed Roman numerals and steel hands; the mechanism, with a wire pendulum, is in working order. Fortunately, this ceremonial clock has retained its original gilding, with only a few signs of wear.- On display in our 400 m² gallery in Lille, open Wednesday through Friday afternoons or by appointment
