Description

Oil on canvas. Late 17th-century French school. The painting is inspired by the one created by Nicolas Poussin around 1635, now in storage at the National Gallery in Edinburgh; however, compared to that work, ours features numerous variations and is much smaller (the entire right side of Poussin's scene--rich in figures in the foreground and background--has been omitted). The subject depicts a biblical episode from the Book of Exodus: the people of Egypt were wandering through the Sinai Desert and had no water; God then commanded Moses to take his staff, gather the elders, and strike the rock at Horeb in front of the people: from it sprang a spring of water, from which the entire people were able to quench their thirst. The painting on display has undergone restoration and re-gilding
